Conservatives oppose housing intensification in Shirley

The current Labour council has made no secret of its view that the suburbs of Croydon are ripe for 'intensification' – code for filling an area with vast amounts of inappropriate housing – and Shirley is one of the four target areas Labour want to saturate with flats.

From Shirley Oaks Village to Longheath Gardens, we have been working with residents' associations to oppose plans that would change the character of the area and remove precious green space. Although there has been some notable success, the true agenda of the Labour council remains clear and only by electing a Conservative Council on May 3rd can we hope to save the character of our community.



All change for Croydon's Ward Boundaries

The independent Local Government Boundary Commission has made a number of changes to Croydon's ward boundaries to take effect from the Council elections taking place on 3rd May this year. The Council is currently run by *Labour* but Shirley North could help change that in May.

The new Shirley North ward contains the eastern half of the old Ashburton ward and that part of the current Shirley ward north of the Wickham Road . To balance elector numbers a few roads south of Wickham Road are also included.



A solution to garden waste chaos

Labour's decision to cut free green waste collections has angered Council Tax payers in Shirley – and seen recycling rates plummet across Croydon.

If a Conservative Council is elected on May 3rd, we will organise 'green waste days' in key district centres – including Shirley - where residents can bring their green waste for free disposal at regular intervals in the summer, meaning that people won't have to face the crowds in the recycling centres in the summer months.

Together, these measures will be good for residents, good for gardens and crucially, good for our precious environment.
