PRIORITIES

Motor Vehicle Crime

In January, **1 Theft from Motor Vehicles** and **3 Theft of Motor Vehicles** took place.

Though numbers are low, we had high valued keyless car thefts this month. All the thefts have taken place at night. All the vehicle stolen were recovered and returned to their owners. This is mainly due to tracking devices. These thieves target high valued vehicles and take them to nearby location and leave it for a period time. The vehicles have been tracked and recovered with little to no damage.

KEEP KEYS A SAFE DISTANCE AWAY: Keeping keys away from doors and windows. Including any **spare keys**.
BLOCK OR TURN OFF THE SIGNAL: Consider purchasing a Faraday pouch to keep key in, including any **SPARE KEYS**. These pouches contain signal-blocking materials that stop your key transmitting its code, preventing thieves from being able to detect and amplify the signal. Check your manual or speak to your dealer to find out if your key can be switched off.

STEERING WHEEL LOCK: Consider using a steering wheel lock, a driveway parking post, or even a wheel clamp.

DOUBLE CHECK: Always manually check if your vehicle is locked.

Burglary

In January, **2 Residential** and **1 Business & Community** Burglaries took place.

We need everyone to continue to take on board our crime prevention advice and to be vigilant. Opportunity plays a big role in enabling people to commit crime, and never more so than burglaries. Most domestic burglaries are committed by 'opportunists'. Criminals will look for homes that:

- Seem unoccupied
- Have little or no obvious security
- Have doors or windows left open,
- Where they think they won't be seen.

One crime often produces the opportunity to commit another – for example, a successful break-in may encourage the burglar to return again in the near future, because they know when the householders are out and expect the property to be full of shiny new replacement good.

Nursery Visit

Officers visited Fennies Nursey on Church Way. It was lovely to meet the children and engage with them, but also give them some advice in terms of not talking to any strangers. We showed them our equipment we wear, and the children took part in wearing our hats. This was mainly aimed at children who were aged 2-4 years old. However while we had some time, we also visited the other class which had younger children, they were in the garden which was great for some interaction with us. We also spoke to a nursey teacher who is interested in joining the police, to which we explained different pathways to her and also spoke about the different things we deal with on a day to day basis

Anti-Corruption and Abuse Hotline

The Met has launched a hotline to report corrupt and abusive police officers and staff.

The launch is part of a wider programme led by the Anti-Corruption and Abuse Command to expose those who have undermined the Met's integrity, letting Londoners down as well as the decent, honest majority of officers and staff in the Met who want to do a good job.

The Metropolitan Police Service Anti-Corruption and Abuse Hotline has been established to collect information about employees of the Met who are corrupt and committing serious crimes or causing harm to others. The hotline will be managed by the independent charity Crimestoppers. Their specially trained staff will answer calls and take information to ensure the anonymity of callers

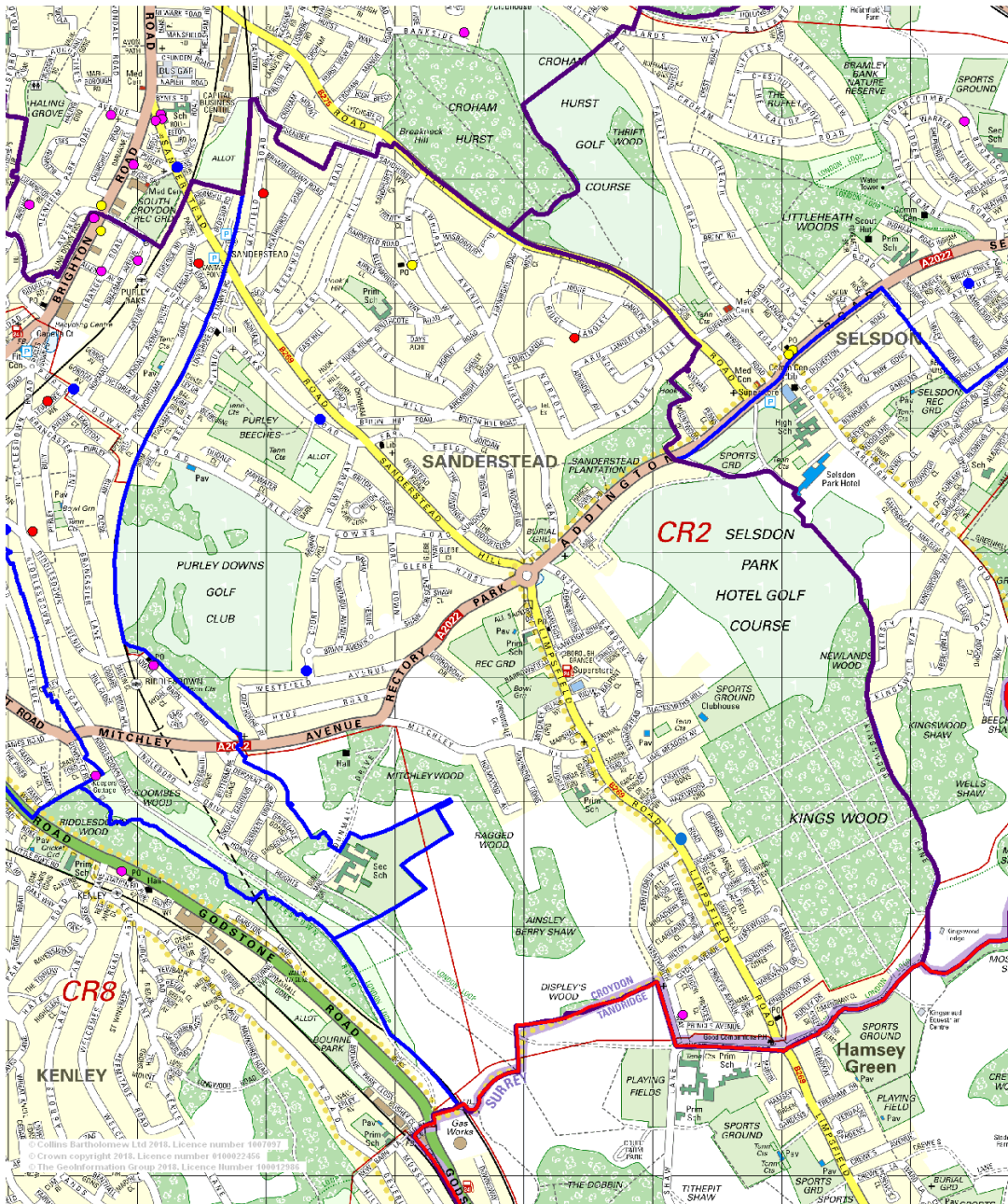
