The first two are Mrs Harris Goes to Paris (PG) on Tuesday 16 May at 11am starring Lesley Manville & Isabelle Huppert. Based on Paul Gallico's book. Mrs Harris is a charlady whose obsession with a Dior dress leads her to save the money required to go to Paris and buy one.

Carmen Jones (U) on Friday 19 May at 11am starring Harry Belafonte & Dorothy Dandridge. An update to Bizet's opera, set in an all-black army camp during the Korean War. Parachute maker Carmen is attracted to Joe, a trainee pilot, but their love affair is doomed.



These Dementia Friendly screenings aim to make cinema more accessible by providing a fun and inclusive experience to enable people living with dementia, their families and carers to attend the cinema in a safe and welcoming environment.

The lights are left on low, there are no adverts or trailers and the audience is allowed to move around or even sing along to any musical numbers if they would like to.

Admission is £5 on the door for people with dementia (carers £2). Tea, coffee and biscuits will be available before the screening.
